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Introduction

In accordance with § 11-934(g) of the Criminal Procedure Article, the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention and Policy (Office) must submit a report to the General Assembly by December 31 of each year, as it relates to all victim services programs and grantees and funds awarded under this section.

Pursuant to its charge, this *2025 Report on All Victim Services Programs and Grantees and Funds Awarded* includes information regarding the distribution of funds for victim services programs when federal Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funding fluctuates. It also identifies the programs funded, the subrecipients of such programs, and the funding source for each grant award. Background

Section § 11-934 of the Criminal Procedure Article, which was established by the Victim Services Stabilization Act of 2023, provides for the development, support, and continuity of victim services programs to provide trauma-informed, high-quality services for victims of crime and to stabilize funding and support for victim services programs by supplementing federal funding for victim services programs when federal VOCA funding fluctuates. It also requires the Office to regularly consult, collaborate with, and consider the recommendations regarding the allocation of funding from:

- The federally recognized State sexual assault coalition;
- The federally recognized State domestic violence coalition;
- The State alliance of child advocacy centers;
- State's Attorney's offices;
- Health care providers assisting victims of crime;
- Civil legal services organizations assisting victims of crime; and
- Representatives of organizations providing services to survivors of child abuse, elder abuse, human trafficking, homicide, or other victims of crime; and
- Prioritize continuity and stability of crime victim services and equitable distribution of funding in every jurisdiction in the State.

In addition, programs must provide services to victims of crime as authorized by the federal VOCA and related regulations. Furthermore, the Governor shall include an appropriation in the

annual State budget that, combined with the amount received under the federal VOCA in the prior year, totals an aggregate \$60 million for the victim services programs funded under the Act.

Victim Services Programs, Grantees, and Funds

The U.S. Department of Justice, Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) awards formula and discretionary grants to states each year “to enhance the delivery of crime victim services throughout the Nation.”¹ This includes VOCA assistance funds which are typically awarded on a competitive basis by the state to local community-based organizations that provide direct services to crime victims.² VOCA assistance funds are multi-year awards with varying allocations from one federal fiscal year to the next, for a performance period of October 1 through September 30.

Following the decrease in the Crime Victims Fund, a major funding source for victim services throughout the nation, historic efforts occurred to stabilize the fund, including the *VOCA Fix to Sustain the Crime Victims Fund Act of 2021* which was signed on July 22, 2021. Because these efforts will take years for the funding to be fully restored, Maryland enacted the Victim Services Stabilization Act of 2023 which requires the Governor to include in the annual budget bill an appropriation that, together with the federal VOCA funding from the prior year, totals an aggregate \$60 million for the victim services programs funded under the Act. Following its enactment, the Office moved the VOCA grant award cycle to the State fiscal year (July 1 through June 30) to more accurately manage the grant fund and ease future predictions of funding needs.

For federal fiscal 2024, the Office received a VOCA assistance allocation of \$14,232,420 to cover a duration of 48 months, from October 1, 2023 through September 30, 2027.³ Because not more than 5% (maximum) of the awarded funds may be used for administrative and training purposes by the Office, \$13,520,799 will be available to subaward in future years. Given the multi-year awards, the federal fiscal 2024 award will be held in reserve to best predict the State fiscal 2026 budget needs to comply with the Victim Services Stabilization Act of 2023. For this reason, the Office used funds from the federal fiscal 2022 and 2023 awards as well as Maryland’s annual budget allocation of \$33,958,002 to ensure a total of \$60 million was available to subaward for victim services programs in State fiscal 2025, as required by the Victim Services Stabilization Act.

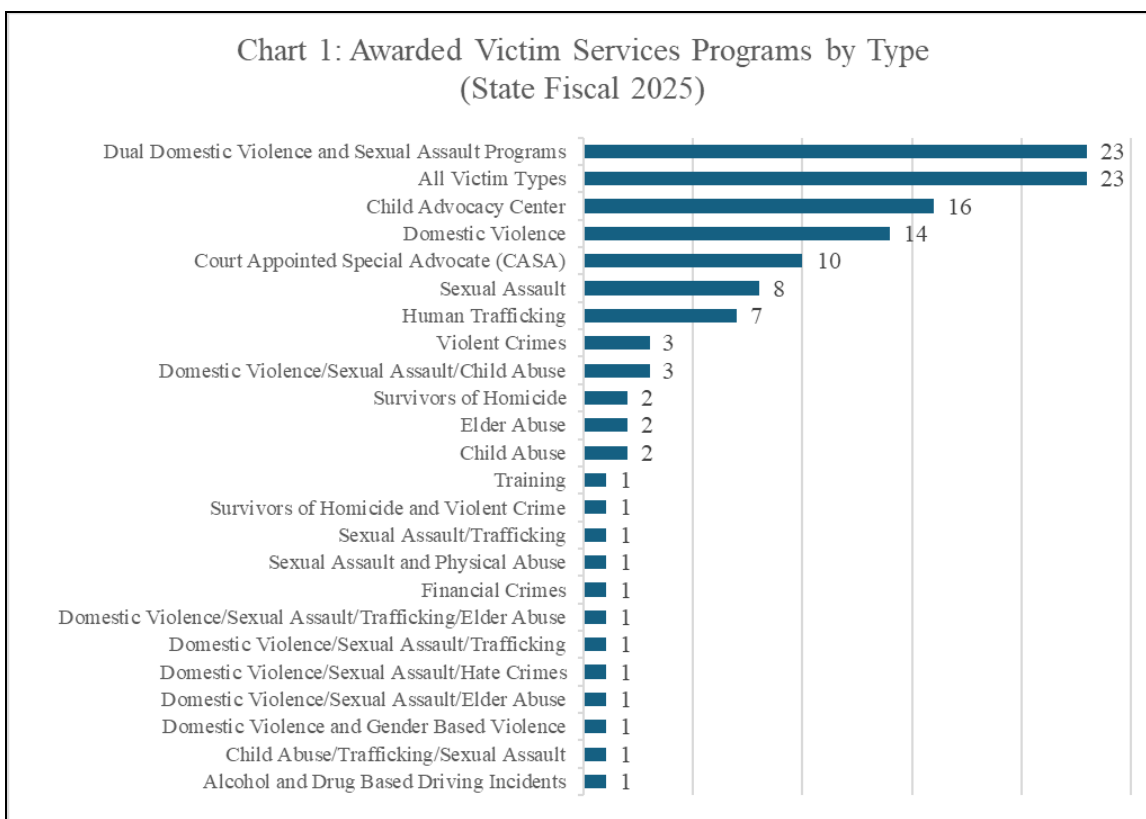

Programs

For the purpose of this report, the Office extracted data from its Grants Management System (GMS) on October 1, 2024, to capture all victim services programs that were funded in State fiscal 2025. Of the 125 funded programs,⁴ nearly 50% (n = 62) were for domestic violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking services (*as shown in **Chart 1***). In addition, over 25% of the programs were funded for child-related services, to include child advocacy centers (n = 16), court appointment special advocates (n = 10), and child abuse services (n = 6). The remaining programs were funded for training and other victim types, to include survivors of homicide, elder abuse, alcohol and drug based driving incidents, and financial crime.

Grantees

For State fiscal year 2025, the Office awarded a total of \$60,584,599 to 125 grantees (also known as subrecipients) to cover a period of July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025 (*as shown in Table 1*).

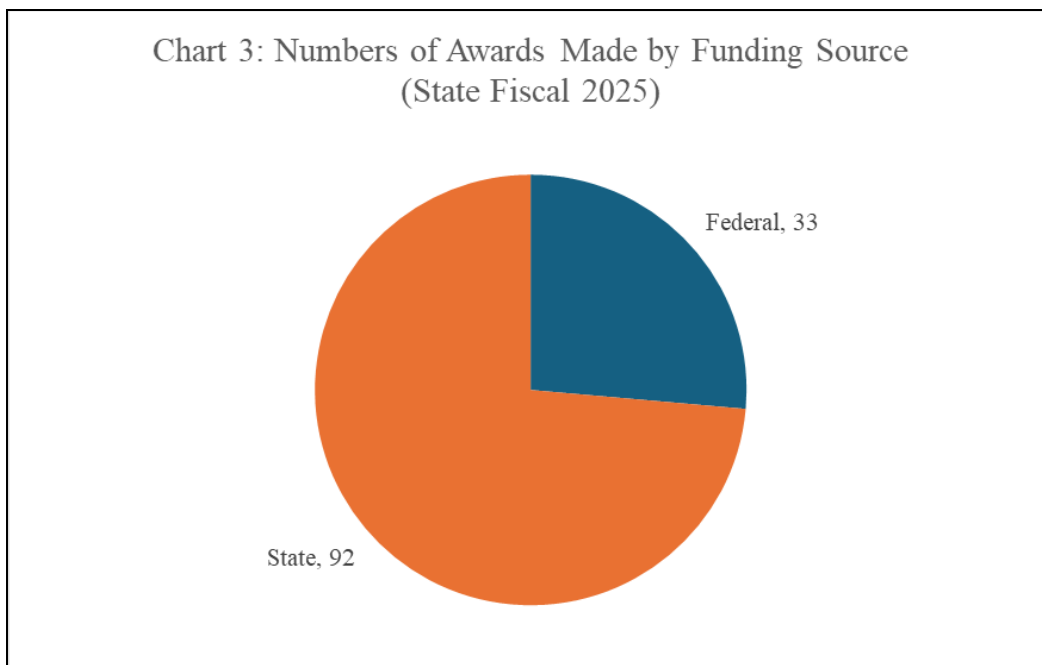
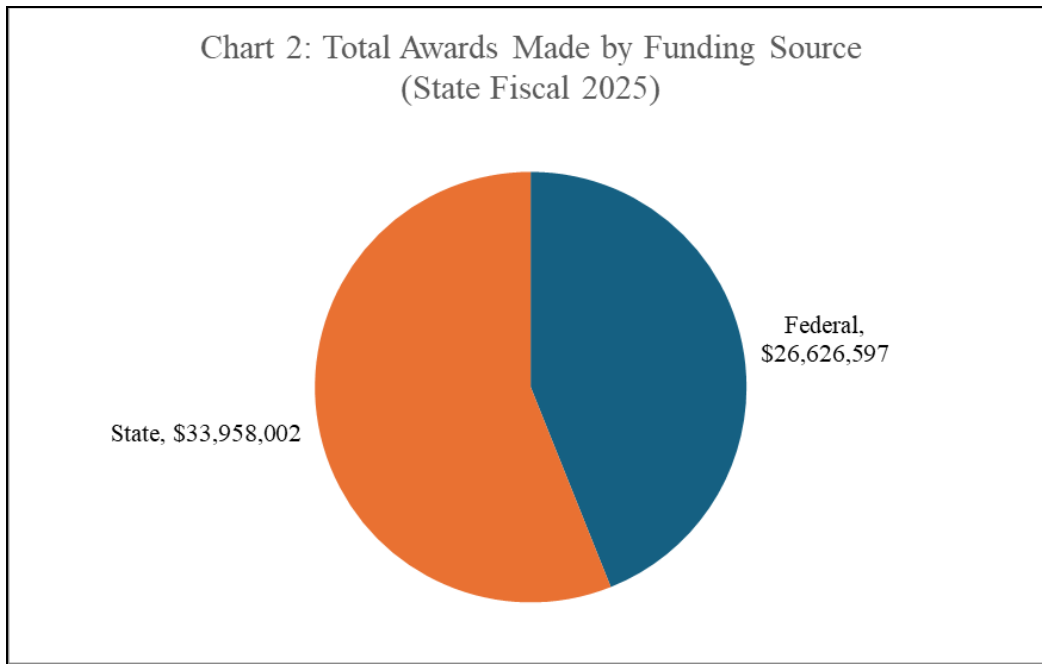

Funds

For State fiscal year 2025, the Office awarded a total of \$60,584,599 to subrecipients which consisted of \$33,958,002 in State general funds and \$26,626,597 in federal VOCA funds (*as shown in **Chart 2***). From this total, 125 awards were made which consisted of 92 using State general funds and 33 from federal VOCA funds (*as shown in **Chart 3***).



Conclusion

In accordance with § 11-934(g) of the Criminal Procedure Article, this *2025 Report on All Victim Services Programs and Grantees and Funds Awarded* includes information regarding the distribution of funds for victim services programs when federal VOCA funding fluctuates. It also identifies the programs funded, the subrecipients of such programs, and the funding source for each grant award.

Given the ongoing fluctuation of VOCA funding, the Office will continue to monitor future federal actions related to the Crime Victim Fund where VOCA money is allocated from. The Office will also work to plan for any potential reduction of funding to victim service providers, based on guidance from OVC.⁵
